

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1.0 Abstract

The "www Research Project" is about, discovering by on line research details of ships, on the MADU data base of wrecks of North Wales , the circumstances of their loss, details of the owners and crew, the cargo carried and their history. The Woodman was a schooner built in Palnackie Kirkcudbrightshire by Alexander Dick and used as a coaster in mainly western Scotland as far north as the Orkney's and into England as far south as Runcorn. Woodman carried a complete range of cargo's from Salt to railway chairs. The complete 64 shares in Woodman were sold in 1861 and it started travelling as far as the south coast and Ireland. This continued under later owners when the Woodman travelled mainly between southern Ireland and south Wales. The Woodman produced few newspaper reports of mishaps until she was based in Ireland and then she was involved in some collisions and a court case where the crew had not been paid in full. The Woodman foundered in a severe storm near Aberporth in 1883 when the crew were rescued by rocket apparatus and a bravery medal was awarded.


3.0 Introduction

- 1. I came across this vessel researching another vessel that had been wrecked and saw that the crew were rescued by the use of rocket apparatus which interested me. I had found some details about it on another previous vessel I had researched, but although the crew were then rescued by the rocket apparatus team they had been unable to use the rocket apparatus because of the vessels position in between cliffs.
- 2. I wanted to find the details of the masters, owners and crew of the Woodman, the cargo's it carried and where it travelled.
- 3. The Woodman was a wooden schooner of 58 tons built in 1841 by Alexander Dick at Palnackie Kirkcudbrightshire. She was 59 feet 4 inches long, 17 feet 8 inches breadth and 8 feet 9 inches draught. As she was described as a schooner she had two masts, a bowsprit and was rigged fore and aft.
- 4. The Woodman had three owners initially each holding 21 or 22 shares, they were businessmen who held shares in a number of other vessels. All the 64 shares in Woodman were sold at auction in 1861 at Barrow in Furness.
- 5. Woodman operated as a coaster mainly on the west coast of Scotland as far North as the Orkney's and into England but also travelling through the Caladonian canal to the east coast of Scotland. The cargo carried was very varied from a regular voyage to Runcorn for salt, to carrying railway chairs to Kirkcudbright and fish to Belfast.
- 6. After its first change in ownership the vessel moved further south travelling to the south coast of England and Ireland, before later owners used her between Ireland and south Wales. The final owner William Murphy seemed to use her to carry goods of coal and manure he sold in other parts of his business. In this period she was usually laid up for part of the winter.
- 7. Woodman was involved in few mishaps until she was sold, when she was involved in a few collisions and a case settled at court when the crew were discharged without full payment.


- 8. Woodman was on a regular voyage in December 1883 from Ireland to South Wales to collect a cargo of coal in ballast when she encountered a severe storm and lost her sails. The alarm was raised on land and the rocket apparatus crew were assembled near the cliffs, a signal rocket was fired to indicate where assistance lay and the crew managed to steer in that direction before striking the rocks. The second rocket fired reached the vessel and the crew were rescued, except for the boy of 14 years who had been lowered over the side to swim ashore with a line. He was rescued from drowning by one of the rocket apparatus crew who received a bravery medal for his actions.
- 9. As the tide flooded the Woodman was lifted off the rocks and sank nearby. At low tide the crew were able to recover their belongings and everything that could be salvaged was sold locally by auction.
- 10. The only previous research involving the Woodman I found was on the Coflein site for her loss and some concerning one of the original owners, Richard Roper who was also an iron master in Lancashire.

4.0 Background

When I started this research all I knew about Woodman was it was a wooden schooner of 58 tons measure built in 1841 and it was involved in an incident at Aberporth, Cardiganshire on 12th December 1883.

5.0 Research Methodology

I used a Microsoft Pixel laptop with access to my home internet running windows 10 operating system. I also used my Apple I pad for research when I was away from the laptop and to assist in transcribing reports from the British newspaper archives. The new internet provider has now connected my home by a fibre connection so it is very much faster. The Lap top uses bling search engine but I also use Goggle which produces less advertisements and less Americanised content.

I searched Lloyds Register of Shipping (LR) for Woodman looking for details of her dimensions, master, builders and owners in 1841 onwards and found no match.

I searched the Crewlist Project for "Woodman" looking for her official number and links to MNL, appropriation book, crew lists, owner and master with a match. I then searched each year from 1865 to 1883 looking for a matches in the record for the vessel to track changes of ownership and port of registration. MNL did not exist in 1841 and before 1865 it only gave port of registration which I knew had not changed. I followed the link to the Irish Archives and found scans of the original crew lists for most of the years she was registered in Ireland.

I searched The British Newspaper Archives for "Woodman", "Woodman Edgar", "Woodman of Kirkcudbright", "Woodman of Cork", "Woodman of Waterford", looking for sailings, arrivals, a launch, owners, builders, mishaps and any details of her loss and found a number of matches. To make the search efficient (thousands of possible matches) I only searched in Lloyds List and the Shipping and Mercantile gazette(SMG). I then searched "Woodman Cowan", "Woodman Hay", "Woodman Furlong", "schooner Woodman" with matches. I searched "Woodman Power" with matches after I found him listed as master of Woodman in a crew list for 1866 and found matches. I searched "Woodman Bent" with matches after I found him listed as master of Woodman in the crew list for July to December 1883 and found matches. I searches "Gibbons Coastguard" looking for the citation for his bravery medal and found a match. I searched "McSweeney Bandon" with no matches, looking for details of the owner in 1866.

I searched "Gilbert Maxwell" with some matches and "John Swainson" with one match after his death the sale of his furniture. I was looking for any details of their lives and business dealings.

I searched Welsh newspapers on line for "Woodman" looking for sailings, arrivals, a launch, owners, builders and any details of her loss and found a number of matches.

I searched Coflein site for "Woodman" and found a match looking for any details of the wreck and a chart, it also contained the vessels dimensions.

I searched via Google on line for "Woodman of Panackie" and found a match in the Dumfries & Galloway archives Shipping Registers for Dumfries 1824-1904, Kirkcudbright 1824-1841, Stranraer 1824-1908 and Wigtown 1836-1908 on line giving details of the builder and first owners. I also searched "Richard Roper" one of the owners and found a site about the history of Lyndal and Marton in Furness which supplied details of his business's and shares in ships.

I searched WrecksiteEU with no match for this vessel.

I searched the Shipping Registers for Dumfries 1824-1904, Kirkcudbright 1824-1841, Stranraer 1824-1908 and Wigtown 1836-1908 in owners and History for "Dick" and "Alexander" and found some matches. I was looking for other vessels he had built or held shares in part ownership. I also found he had been associated with Garlieston in the Solway Forth and other individuals with the same surname from Garlieston also owned shares in vessels. The search did not produce all entries for "Dick" but "Alexander" produced some, including many without the surname Dick. I also searched "Maxwell" and "Swainson" looking for details of any ships they had ownership interests in and found some matches.

I searched the National Archives of Ireland for "Woodman" and found matches for crew lists for most years from 1866 until 1877. I also searched for the masters of Woodman from 1866 but only Nicholas Bent produced a match on another vessel. I also searched for "John Roach" the "boy" rescued when Woodman sank with no match.

Liverpool Mail - Saturday 06 May 1843

Tuesday morning last, Mary Hodgkins, a girl of the town, whilst in a state of intoxication, jumped from the east quay of George's dock basin on to the deck of the schooner Woodman, and was much injured. It being low water at the time, she must have fallen a distance twenty-eight or thirty feet. Inspector McHarg, with several of his men and some riggers, assisted in getting the unfortunate creature upon the quay, and she was afterwards conveyed to the Northern Hospital, where her injuries were attended to.

Shipping and Mercantile Gazette - Monday 12 June 1843

DONEGAL—June 8: Put Into Killybegs -The Woodman, Edgar, for Runcorn; and Strangford, M'Kie. for Liverpool; both from Donegal; having met heavy gale of wind, were forced to bear up for the harbour; after remaining two days, sailed again. Wind S.E.

N. E., distant five miles, in about eight fathoms water.

Greenock Advertiser - Friday 01 October 1847

Gatehouse, Galloway, Sept. 23.—The Woodman, Edgar, of Kirkcudbright, from Cromarty for Liverpool, put in here yesterday, having sailed from Stromness the 15th, and on the 16th encountered very heavy gales off Cape Wrath; lost boat, split sails, and had the deck timber totally washed overboard, otherwise all well.






Carmarthen Weekly Reporter - Saturday 26 November 1864

MILFORD HAVEN. It blew a hurricane here on Friday morning, with a very heavy sea running, and such was its fury, that the steam ferry bunts which cross Prom Neyland to Hulk's Point were unable, at least for some time, to go over, and the morning mail had to be landed at Pembroke Ferry as It was dangerous attempting to land at the pier. At Milford a very large American ship of 1,200 tons broke adrift and ran foul of several vessel, totally dismasting two of them and severely damaging four others. The schooner Woodman, from Newport to Kinsale, with coal, had to slip from near the Stack Rock Fort, losing both anchors and chains and ran to Pembroke Dock Pill, where she brought up on the mud.

Belfast Morning News - Monday 30 March 1868

The schooner Woodman got into collision with three-masted schooner, bound to Liverpool, off Waterford harbour, on the night of the inst. The Woodman was much damaged.

Shipping and Mercantile Gazette - Tuesday 31 March 1868

Report of Captain Dalton, of the Schooner Woodman of and for Waterford from Cardiff (coals), reported on the 28th inst. with damage Left Cardiff March 24. On 25th, at 930 p.m., wind by N, strong breeze, weather clear, Saltees Light bearing by compass NNE. and Hook Tower bearing N by W, ship starboard tack, heading W by S, lights burning clear, the watch on look-out reported a green light on our starboard bow. In about 10 minutes afterwards lost sight of green light, then opened red light. I then told the watch on deck to call the watch below so that they might save themselves I expected collision, when the vessel immediately opened her two side lights. All hands board the Woodman called out to the stranger, but could get no reply, and she immediately ran into our starboard main rigging, carrying away our main rail, bulwarks, stanchions, starting treenails and taffrail, also main rigging, Ac. She proved to be the Ocean Spray, three-masted schooner. At that time my crew, expecting the Woodman was sinking, jumped on board the Ocean Spray, and accused the captain of negligence. His reply was, we had no lights burning, but the Woodman wore round the lights were quite visible, which he had to acknowledge. After remaining on board the Ocean Spray for few minutes we returned to our ship and proceeded for Waterford, where we arrived on 27th, at p.m., making much water and with pumps strictly attended to.

Lloyd's List - Wednesday 01 April 1868

WATERFORD arrived 27 Woodman, Dalton Cardiff with loss of bulwarks, stanchions, rail, main rigging, &c., and making much water, having been in collision with the Ocean Spray (3-masted schr.) (see paragraph in List of 28th Mar.)

Shipping and Mercantile Gazette - Thursday 02 April 1868

WATERFORD-March 30: The Woodman, Dalton, from Cardiff, which was in collision 26th inst. off the harbour, lost bulwarks, stanchions, rail, main rigging, Ac., and makes water. The vassal in collision with her was the Ocean Spray, three-masted schooner.—{see the Shipping and Mercantile Gazette of March 28.]

A SAILORS WAGES.—John Shaw summoned Philip Murphy for £3 wages The plaintiff deposed he shipped on the Woodman on February last, the 8th, at £3 per month; he was settled with by Captain Dalton shipped with at first, but when he left, Capt. Cox succeeded, and plaintiff was discharged the 13th March, without any notice, after he had entered on the second month. Mr. Strange cross examined the witness, to show the engagement was for one month, for a voyage to Bristol, and that the engagement was at end, being a personal contract with Captain Dalton. Captain Dalton disposed he was Master of the Woodman, and defendant was mate, he shipped the plaintiff at £3-a month.

Mr. Strange -If voyage lasted five weeks, the men would be discharged.

To Mr. Howard-The ship was bound for Bannow, she went to Bristol.

To Court-If he had remained in the ship, when I came on to Waterford, I would have discharged the men.

Mr. Howard- that's the rule, but our case it that we were discharged before the men came to a port of discharge.

Court-Where is the vessel now

Mr. Strange-At Bannow.

Captain Johnson-That's the point of the case-where was the vessel discharged Mr. Strange said the case was that the vessel was bought at auction by Mr. Murphy, who did not take over this crew at all, the voyage having ended. Shaw said if he shipped here, and lay down at Passage for a month, and left the ship, he would be liable to imprisonment, and lose his wages, and it seems not fair that a man should be able to discharge him before his contract had ended. Mr. Strange contended the port discharge was Waterford, and Mr. Howard, that it was Bannow.

Captain Johnson Did Mr. Murphy offer to, pay them any money

Shaw-Mr. Walsh, the auctioneer, settled with us, and I owed him 1s up to that date, having given the women money while we were away.

Captain Johnson-Is the vessel at Bannow

Mr. Murphy-She is, she was there on Wednesday.

Mr. Howard-How you know; did you get a letter, or telegram

Mr. Murphy-No.

Mr. Howard- I credibly informed she hat not arrived yet.

An order was made for the four days wages from the 13th the 17th, and 5s 6d costs.

There were two other cases which were determined by the first case.

A COLLISION IN MILFORD HAVEN.

The schooner Woodman, of Waterford, Furlong master, when working up the Haven yesterday, ran into the schooner Rockingham. of Dublin (Golden, master), carrying away bowsprit, jibboom. and other gear. The collision occurred off the Stack Rock fort.

ROCKINGHAM – Report of Thomas Golden, master of the schooner Rockingham, of Dublin, 64 tons, from Wicklow on Aug. 13 for Brittonferry, in ballast: - On the 17th at 11 30 A.M. the tide at the time young flood, weather squally, wind E.S.E, a strong breeze, the vessel was at anchor off the Stack Rock Fort, in Milford Haven, in the middle of the channel, when the Woodman schooner of Waterford, in standing across our bow, fouled us and carried away our jibboom and bowsprit. Her fore rigging took our jibboom and her main rigging took our bowsprit. We weighed anchor this morning, and worked up off Milford and anchored at 0 30 P.M., when I came on shore to the customs House, Aug.17 – Milford , Aug. 18

Wexford People - Wednesday 09 November 1881

BOAT ACCIDENT.—On Saturday evening, about 5 p.m, a sailing party consisting of the Misses Colclongh Tintern Abbey and young Mr. Copeman, Salt Mills had a narrow escape from drowning in Bannow harbour. Their small sail-boat in coming round at the Horsetread capsized. Captain Furlong and crew of the schooner Woodman, lying in the harbour, were coming ashore. and perceiving the accident, bent their oars to the rescue. They arrived just in time to save the lives of the party, who were all clinging to the boat and crying frantically for help. One of the ladies was in a very exhausted condition the brave rescuers, having got the sufferers into their boat, brought them safely to the Abbey where, when the accident was made known, the rescuing party met a most hospitable reception. Dr. Boyd, Bannow, was sent for, and remained in attendance on the ladies during

the night. Mr Copeman was none the worse of his immersion. Had not Captain Furlong and seamen been in the vicinity, the pleasure party would be most probably drowned, as there was no other boat within saving distance - A Correspondent.

Morning Post Friday 14 December 1883

A telegram from St. Dogmael's coast-guard station, Dec. 13, states that the Woodman (schooner), of Waterford, ran ashore on the rocks at Aberporth, and filled with water, but afterwards drifted off on to the beach. She lost all her sails in the gale.

SHIPWRECK AT ABERPORTH. On Wednesday morning the inhabitants of Aberporth were thrown into a state of intense excitement by the announcementmade by a man who entered the village on horseback, at full gallop-that a vessel was approaching close along shore, the crew having, apparently, lost all control over her, owing to the furious gale which was at that time blowing. The coastquards instantly set to work, assisted by many others, and after a short delay the rocket apparatus was brought out and placed close to the cliffs. By this time, the masts of the vessel began to appear behind Cribach Head, when a rocket was instantly fired off as a signal to the crew that help was at hand if they could possibly manage to direct the vessel's course towards the beach. This the captain succeeded in doing, and in a few moments the ill-fated craft struck on a rock and stuck fast, rolling heavily through the violence of the waves. After two unsuccessful attempts, a line was at last thrown on board, and the crew were all safely landed, the captain being the last to leave the vessel. The vessel proved to be the Woodman, of Wexford, in ballast. On the rising of the tide she floated in towards the beach, turned round, and sank till the waves swept her deck. At low water the crew went on board and removed such articles as they were unable to bring ashore in the morning.

Lloyd's List - Thursday 20 December 1883

WOODMAN- St. Dogmael, Dec. 19, 11 53 a.m.The Woodman schooner is a total wreck, and what is saved from her will be sold tomorrow.

St James's Gazette - Monday 21 January 1884

Awards for Saving Life.

The committee of the Royal Humane Society has awarded a medal to Mr. A. T. Orr, assistant managing engineer of the Barrow Shipbuilding Company, for rescuing a boy who fell from the steamship Camden into the dock at Barrow-in-Furness on the evening of the 6th of October. A medal has also been awarded to Peter Gibbons, boatman of the coastguard station, St. Dogmaels, Liverpool district, for saving J. Roach, of the schooner Woodman, and being also instrumental in saving the lives of the remainder of the crew of the same vessel on the 12th of December.

Buckingham Advertiser and Free Press - Saturday 26 January 1884

On the recommendation of the Admiral Superintendent of Naval Reserves, the medal was also awarded to Peter Gibbons, boatman coastguard station, St. Dogmaels, Liverpool district, for saving the, the schooner Woodman, and being also instrumental in saving the remainder the crew of the same vessel. In this case it appears that about half past twelve on the night of the 12th of December, during strong gale from the north-west, the schooner stranded on a reef of rocks over which the sea was breaking terrific force. Roach was lowered over vessel's side with the evident intention swimming, if possible, to shore with a line. Unfortunately, however, owing to the strong current and force of the wind, he immediately disappeared. Gibbon's determination to effect a rescue was attended with numerous dangers, not the least of which was the probability his being flashed pieces the rocks, but he persisted and, plunging into the sea, struck out boldly and at last clutched the drowning man, rose with him to the surface, and landed him on shore, both being much exhausted. The remainder the crew were subsequently rescued means the rocket apparatus.

Palnackie

In 1844 there were temporary wooden quays, where 6 vessels could moor. These sloops could be 20-40 foot long. Mooring posts were installed, an access road was built and harbour dues charged. In 1847 the harbour was faced with timber for 300ft with 20ft of water at spring tides. By 1849 the creek was opened out and converted to a dock. The dock was excavated on the land owned by Barlochan Estate and Orchardton Estate. The harbour was kept silt free by releasing a sluice gate at the end of Brig Barwhinnie Loch. When the tide was half way out the water would rush down from the loch and out into the harbour. The dock is about 300ft on its north west side and 220ft on the south east side by 40ft wide. Palnackie harbour could accomodate vessels up to 350 tons. Palnackie was an export port for millstones from Glenlstocken as early as 1650, the stones being cut beside Castle Point beach and rafted to Palnackie for shipment to Glasgow. Palnackie was also a ship building site and the last ship to be built at Palnackie was a boat called the Maksicar by Mr Clifford Henderson. The ship called the Sarah and Isabella was a 2-masted topsail schooner which was owned and run by Captain Black traded coal from Planackie. Many different cargoes were traded in and out of Palnackie such as barley, treacle, timber, granite, cattle feed and oats.



Woodman of Kircudbright was a 58 ton schooner was built by Alexander Dick at Palnackie in 1841. Richard Roper bought 22 shares. J Swainson and G Maxwell,

both wood merchants held 21 shares each. In 1862, she arrived in Ulverston with bobbinwood from Gatehouse of Fleet, and carried ore to Glasgow.

Dissolution of Partnership. MESSRS GILBERT MAXWELL and ANDREW GRAY, Wood and Bark Merchants, Collin Mills, Auchencnirn, have This Day DISSOLVED PARTNERSHIP with mutual consent; and tie Business will, in future, be carried on by MAXWELL alone. Collin Mills, Auchencairn, 23rd July 1856.

Richard Roper

Richard Roper was a shipping agents as well as an ironmaster. Between 1815 and 1860, Richard and Thomas Roper bought shares in dozens of vessels. Some were controlled through a minority shareholding, but in other cases, like the Bee, they held shares but were not managers.

1824 Richard Roper joined the partnership of Harrison Ainslie iron founders using charcoal. They also built a gunpowder works in Melfort near Oban run by Richard Roper's grandson.

Richard Roper died in 1860

The Harrison Ainslie company existed in some form until 1966 when it closed.

Alexander Dick shipbuilder

The Woodman is the only vessel a search lists as built by Alexander Dick but the builders of many other vessels from Garlieston and Palnackie are not known.

Wm Murphy Carrig, Bannow, Co Wexford

FIT FOR SEA. The schooner "Naiad" owned by Mr. William Murphy, of Bannow. is at present discharging a cargo in Wexford. About twelve months ago this vessel was condemned by the Board of Trade, but her owner has had her completely overhauled and put into a seaworthy condition. All the repairs were executed at home.

Irish Times - Monday 04 January 1875

WATERFORD. Intelligence reached Waterford Saturday evening that the barque Genesse, bound from Plymouth to Glasgow, with cargo of saltpetre, was total wreck the Waterford coast, about mile from Bonmahon. On inquiring yesterday our correspondent ascertained that during the gale the previous night she was dashed on the rock, despite the exertions the crew, where she stranded. The sea swept over her, carrying with it a portion of her bulwarks and three of the crew - all being drowned; the remainder of the crew, nine number, succeeded in getting on the rocks and were saved. The vessel has gone to pieces. Thomas Walsh, agent to the ship wrecked, and Mr O'Donoghue, receiver of wrecks, visited the scene, the former providing for the survivors.

7.0 Analysis

The Niaid was recorded in the MNL from 1888 as having the same owner as the Woodman, and although there were numerous Murphy's the Wm Murphy who was an agent for the chemical manure and also sold whiskey, brandy and port to the Poor Law Commissioners appears to be the same person residing in Corrig on Bannow. In the Wexford County Guide 1885 there are two William Murphy's one is postmaster and Schoolmaster and the other is a general merchant, the owner of Woodman. He is not listed as a land owner.

The records of sailing's and arrival's from 1874 appeared to show Woodman was being laid up over the winter and in the crew list for 1877 I found a note that it was laid up until 29th February 1877, although there was no 29th that year. It also records arriving at Cork on 31st February so Bannow and the Woodman was short of a calendar. The date of change of master is not recorded in 1871 from Cox to Williams, the crew list has been written all in one hand by Williams but records in SMG show Cox as master until November, so I have followed that pattern, November is also when Woodman was usually laid up. The previous crew list ending 30th June, states Cox is continuing and not discharged. The crew lists vary greatly in the detail they contain but it appears John Williams has received some instruction because his logs improve in clarity but unfortunately lose the sailing dates. None of them include all the voyages made by Woodman and it is something they are required by law to complete and are checked, as seen from the note of William Murphy excusing his late submission.

Woodman was engaged during the ownership of William Murphy in carrying coal from South Wales to mainly Bannow where he was listed as a coal merchant, carrying manure, (chemical not animal waste), for which he was a local agent for a company based in Dublin and Cork.

The British newspaper archives provided most of the records of the sailings and incidents for Woodman, with the Welsh newspapers on line providing some of the records for the period it was visiting Wales. The National archives of Ireland provided crew lists from 1866 until 1883 in which there are recorded some sailings of Woodman. The crew list from July to December 1883 revealed that the master had changed in July to Nicholas Bent, the only records of voyages I had found for that period had been in the Welsh newspapers on line and the masters name was missing. The J. Roach mentioned in the bravery medal awarded to Peter Gibbons, boatman of the coastguard station, St. Dogmaels, was John Roach, listed as ,boy, 14 years born in Bannow, Co. Wexford. He was lowered over the side of the vessel to swim ashore with a line, and quickly started to drown.

A boy on a sailing ship of this time was not an apprentice who would be trained to become a vessel's officer, but an untrained crew member who may become an able seaman when sufficient experienced.

The Woodman was being carried by the current and the wind, with no sails when the first rocket was fired to indicate where they may find rescue. The windage on the bare ship must have been propelling it through the water faster than the current for the vessel to be steered towards the cliffs. A boat can only be steered if water is passing over her rudder by her motion through the water rather than being carried along by the waves and current. The sea is different to a road being travelled along, it moves, sometimes violently and often rapidly along the coast and particularly around headlands.

8.0 Conclusions & Recommendations

I have spent about 60 hours on this research because the Woodman was active for 42 years until its loss in 1883 and I spent about 95% of the time on line.

A destination for the Woodman from about 1869 was often given as Barrow or Bannow, the Woodman was not recorded as having arrived or sailed to Barrow in Furness but to Bannow in Co Wexford where her owner resided. This included being recorded as sailing to Barrow but arriving at Bannow with insufficient time for an additional journey from Barrow to Bannon. Bannow was and is still very small so was unlikely to report to the SMG. The reports of arrival at Bannow generally came from the crew lists.

I have followed every avenue of research available on line without paying for sites like ancestry.com to trace relatives of the persons mentioned in the report, which would be difficult without dates and places of birth.

I continue to improve in my selection of search words for the newspapers to reduce the number of matches to manageable numbers to make best use of my time.

The research has answered my original questions and considering the length of time it covered the records have survived except for a few periods.

There is no wreck site for the Woodman, it sank after sliding off the rocks as the tide flooded, but at low tide the crew were able to board and recover their belongings. The remains of the vessel that could be recovered were sold for salvage.

The story of the Woodman is long and fairly ordinary and she avoided most mishaps until her final loss when the actions to save her crew were something out of the ordinary by a method which has been forgotten.





Appendix D Rocket Apparatus



"The marine department of the Board of Trade now maintains about three hundred stations furnished with complete life-saving apparatus - 195 on the coast of England and Wales, 45 on those of Scotland, 51 on the Irish coasts, and others in the Isle of Man, the Channel Islands, and Heligoland, besides supplying many more with life-belts and lines. The apparatus is under the charge of the Coast Guard, wherever there is a Coast Guard station, and in many cases there are companies of volunteers, not connected with the Life-boat service, who are enrolled up to a number sufficient, with the Coast Guard, or in the absence of the Coast Guard to provide 25 men for working the apparatus.

The Trenghouse Rocket

On 29th December 1807 Henry Trenghouse witnessed the wreck of the Royal Navy frigate Anson on the Cornish coast. Although only 100 yards from the shore there was no way of rescuing the sailors and over a hundred lives were lost. This disaster led Trenghouse to invent the Rocket life-saving apparatus.


An improved rocket was invented by John Dennett in 1826 and this, in turn, was replaced by a rocket devised by Colonel Boxer in 1855.

Compared to the mortar the rocket was much lighter, easier to move, more accurate, less likely to break the line after firing and cheaper. The rocket completely superseded the mortar and, after the lifeboat, became the most important means of saving lives from shipwrecks.

By the end of the 19th century almost 14,000 lives had been saved by the rocket apparatus.

Hawser

The Hawser was a line (Rope) which was tied to the whip at the shore side, so those on the shore can pull the hawser to the ship using the other whip, those on board the stricken vessel then tied it above the whip and signalled the shore when completed.




Fig. 2 Rescue by Lifesaving rocket apparatus
