

St Johannes (13/09/1800) MADU ref:4

The *St Johannes (Saint Johannes)*, a Dutch wooden sailing vessel on passage from Liverpool to Falmouth (Coflein states Malaga but I think this is incorrect) in ballast was lost near Cardigan Island in early September 1800. The Captain, thought to be called Blandon or Blandou (Amsterdam Newspaper, 09/10/1800, Coflein 272442).

Pwllheli Packet (30/09/1873) MADU ref:204

The *Pwllheli Packet* a 19gt wooden smack foundered off Porthor (Porth Oer) after a week of gales at the end of September 1873. It was built in Porthmadog in 1833

The *Pwllheli Packet* was lost 4 miles north-east of Bardsey (1 mile south of Porth Cadlan) after springing a leak. It was owned at the time of loss by O Jones of Byncroes, Caernarfon and was carrying 33 tons of roofing slate from Caernarfon to Haverfordwest. The crew were saved after taking to their boat and the ship sank 15 minutes later (Lloyds List 03/10/1873 & Coflein, 271445).
